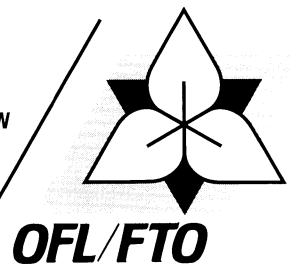

The Ontario Federation of Labour will hold a two-day "Workers Under 30" Conference on Saturday, September 30 to Sunday, October 1, 2006. The conference will be taking place at the Larkin Building at the University of Toronto (15 Devonshire Place).

Registration will take place on Saturday, September 30 from 8:00 a.m. to 8:30 a.m. at the East Entrance of the Larkin Building at the University of Toronto.

The purpose of the conference is to give workers 30 year of age and under hands-on knowledge of unions and workers' rights in Ontario in the context of several issues:
